This includes costume designing, curating, altering, caretaking, and prop building, along with puppet design and construction. That's just about a bazillion loads of laundry, a kazillion alterations, a fi-fi-fillion hours spent shopping, sourcing and creating. (Not to mention the countless moments spent waiting in line to have her yards of fabric cut while praying no one asks her, "Whatcha making?" (Because, it's much easier to tell them 'Pajama pants' instead of the odd costume piece required in the script.) She was the first artist to Costume Design the musical, BKLYN off-Broadway, and has worked with professional Broadway and Regional actors alike, along with countless glossy-eyed aspiring actors. Her most favorites will always be the kind and compassionate ones who are smart enough to know that it takes the cooperation and teamwork of the entire cast, crew, and production team to produce and put on a great show. Amber has studied her favorite comedians, and healthcare clowning for the last 20 years, taking the art of humor to the people who truly need it most. If you pull out your magnifying glass, you will see that humor, silliness, and playfulness is endlessly layered within each morsel of the art she creates. This is witnessed from the cushy theatre seats you're sitting in and in the chairs driven by a helper, with handlebars and big wheels attached to the back. It's never just about theatre, it is always about entertainment, and promoting the notion that spontaneous joy and laughter soothe the spirit. WHO ARE THE MAIN CHARACTERS?

Emcee - He is the master of ceremonies at the Kit Kat Klub. He also comments on the action of the play.

Fräulein Schneider - Fräulein Schneider is the owner of the rooming house that Cliff stays at. While she is very traditional, she realizes that she is getting old and that, in the long run, small things don't always matter.


Clifford Bradshaw - Cliff is a novelist from Pennsylvania searching for something to write about. His travels have taken him all over Europe and he has finally arrived in Berlin. Little does Cliff know, he will find much more than he bargained for.

Fräulein Kost - A prostitute living in Fräulein Schneider's rooming house. She tries to fool Fräulein Schneider about her business daily and tends to get away with it. Fräulein Kost is similar to Ernst Ludwig—she seems pleasant, despite her actions; however, we see a different side of her later on in the story.

Sally Bowles - Sally is an English-born singer living in Berlin. Her lifestyle is that of a liberated woman: doing what she pleases and enjoying life to the fullest.

Herr Schultz - Herr Schultz also lives in the rooming house that Fräulein Schneider owns. He is a Jewish fruit store owner and woos Fräulein Schneider with exotic fruit. Despite the rise of the Nazis, he does not feel endangered and continues his life without worry.

Ernst - Ernst is a friendly, helpful person at first. His pleasantness helps Cliff find a place to stay, as well as provide him with some income to live. However, Ernst is a smuggler and has a dark side to him that is not revealed in the beginning.





The word "cabaret" is an old French term for taproom or tavern, social spaces where there were often impromptu per-

formances. But, by the late 19th century, the word was used to describe gatherings of artists - poets, musicians, visual artists, actors, directors - who came together to share new work and, importantly, to critique mainstream society. Cabaret from its inception, has been an art form dedicated to the counter-culture, to pushing the boundaries of art, to questioning society.

The first formal cabaret, Le Chat Noir (the Black Cat), opened in Paris in 1881.

Le Chat Noir established the hallmarks of the art form. Patrons sat at tables to eat and drink while they watched a variety show on a small stage. The space was small, the performances intimate. The show was hosted by a conferencier, a type of emcee (or master of ceremonies), which further minimized the physical and psychological distance between performer and spectator. Early cabaret audiences were primarily other artists, philosophers, and journalists - the cultural elite. Interestingly, many of these art forms were associated not with high art or culture, but with circuses, music halls, and street performers. This tension between "high" and "low" art would continue to define cabaret.





Origins of German Cabaret

The first successful German cabaret, the Uberbrettl ("super variety theatre"), opened in Berlin in January 1901. Early German cabaret took itself seriously and endeavored to showcase true art, presented in a "refined and tasteful" way by professionals. Berlin was then part of the German Empire, ruled by an emperor. Strict censorship laws prevented the cabaret from satirizing political topics or presenting overtly sexual material. Many stars of the German cabaret, both in the early years and later, were Jewish.

Between 1901 and the outbreak of World War 1 in 1914, cabarets were established in both Berlin and Munich, some leaning toward a more popular entertainment style, others firmly literary in their aspirations. By the start of World War 1, German cabaret had moved away from counter-cultural art and toward a commercial venture. Those in attendance were middle class pleasure-seekers out to enjoy their champagne while watching an uncontroversial variety show that featured sexual innuendo and racist humor.

Living in Weimar Germany

During the Weimar era, 1918 to Hitler's rise to power in 1933, many Germans lived life to the fullest. The era was known for its over-the-top and excessive lifestyles. People were not afraid to express themselves socially, politically, and sexually. Experimentation was a common word during this time - from art to culture to religion and much more. The people of Germany were in a state that allowed them to try new things with little backlash from the government. Cabarets flourished providing entertainment for all. By the mid-1920s, around 50,000 gays and lesbians lived in Berlin. With its countless nightclubs and meeting points for homosexuals, bisexuals, or transvestites, the city became a true "Eldorado" for this growing and vibrant community. Germany also became the center of many movements including Dadaism and Expressionism. Artists like Otto Dix, George Grosz and John Heartfield painted pictures reflecting what they saw. We have added this artwork to our Cabaret through the projections that you will see throughout the performance.
